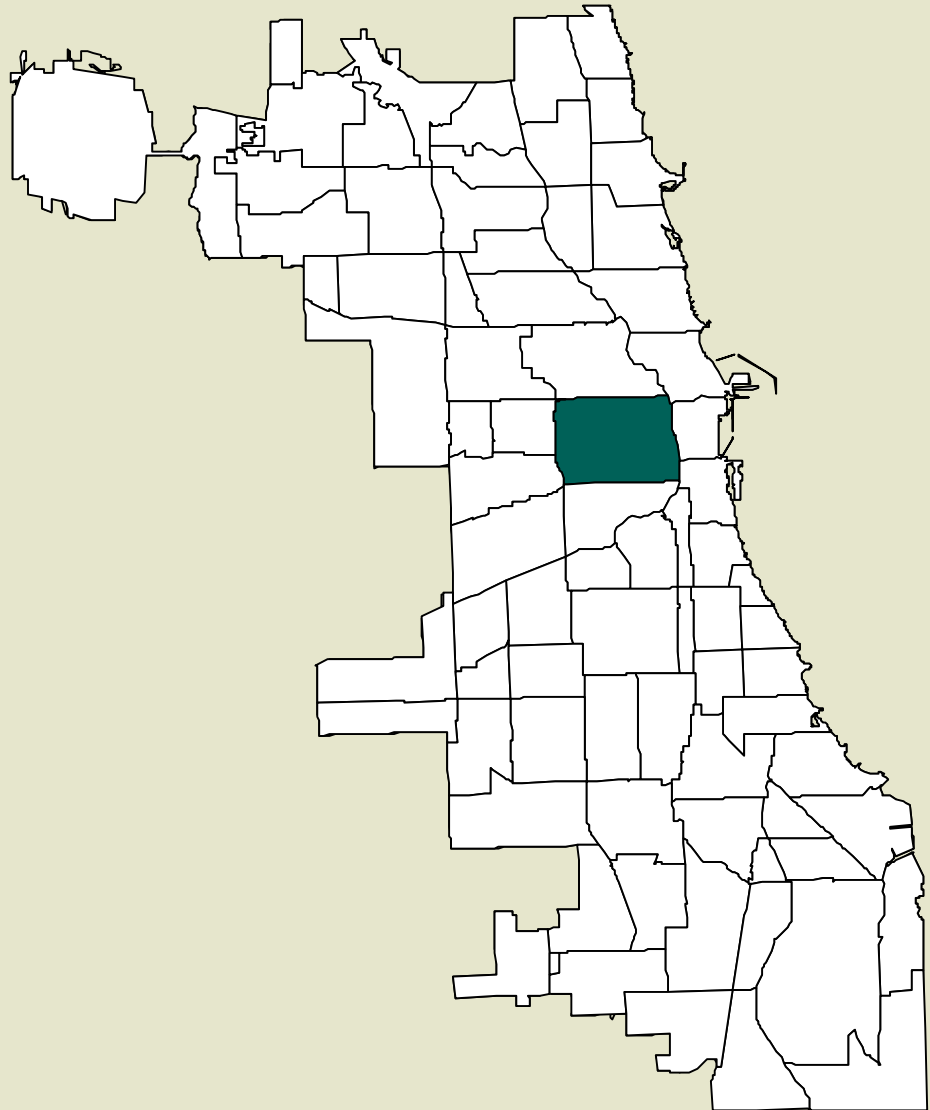

Health Care Facilities Near West Side Community Area (CA) 28

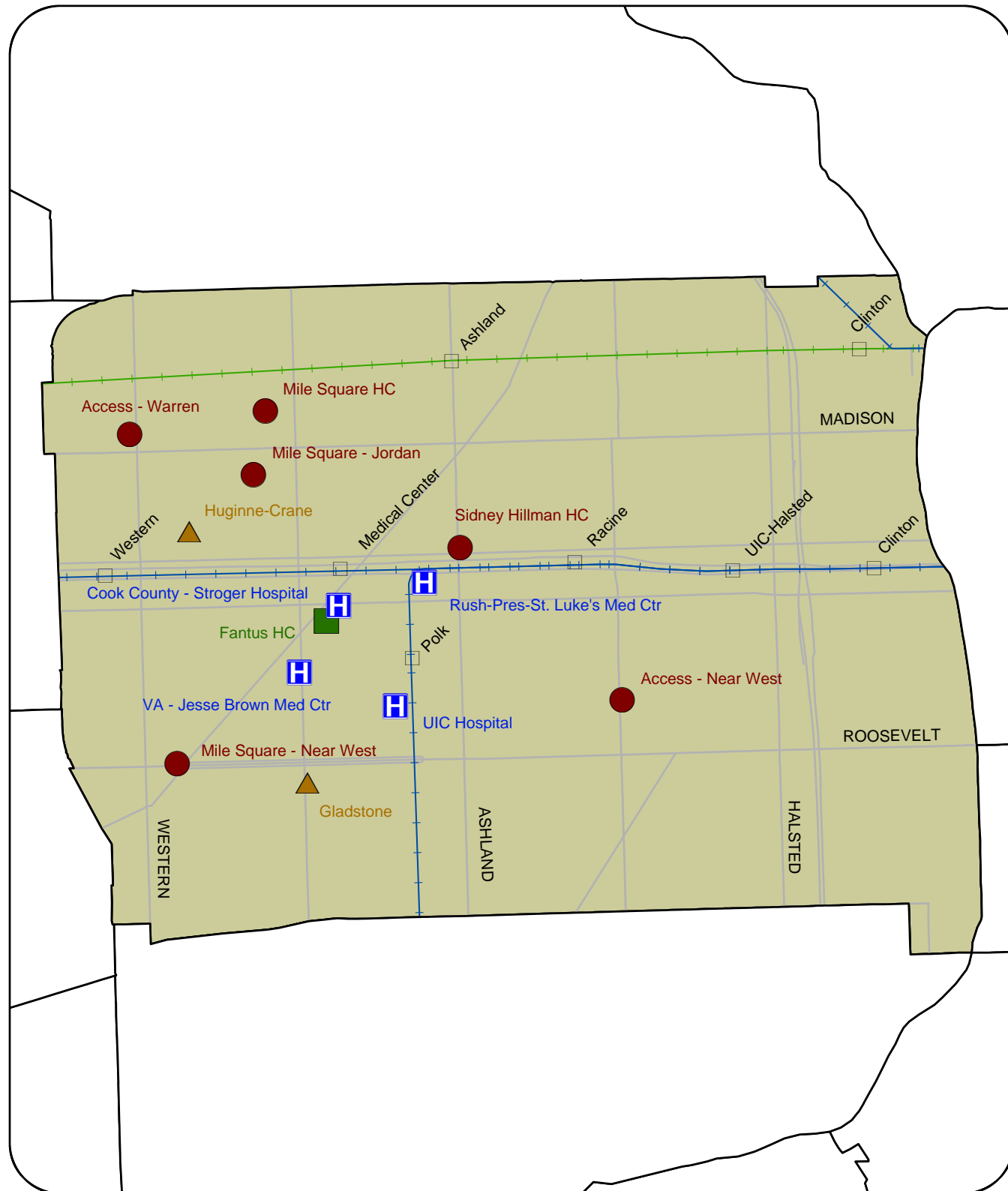

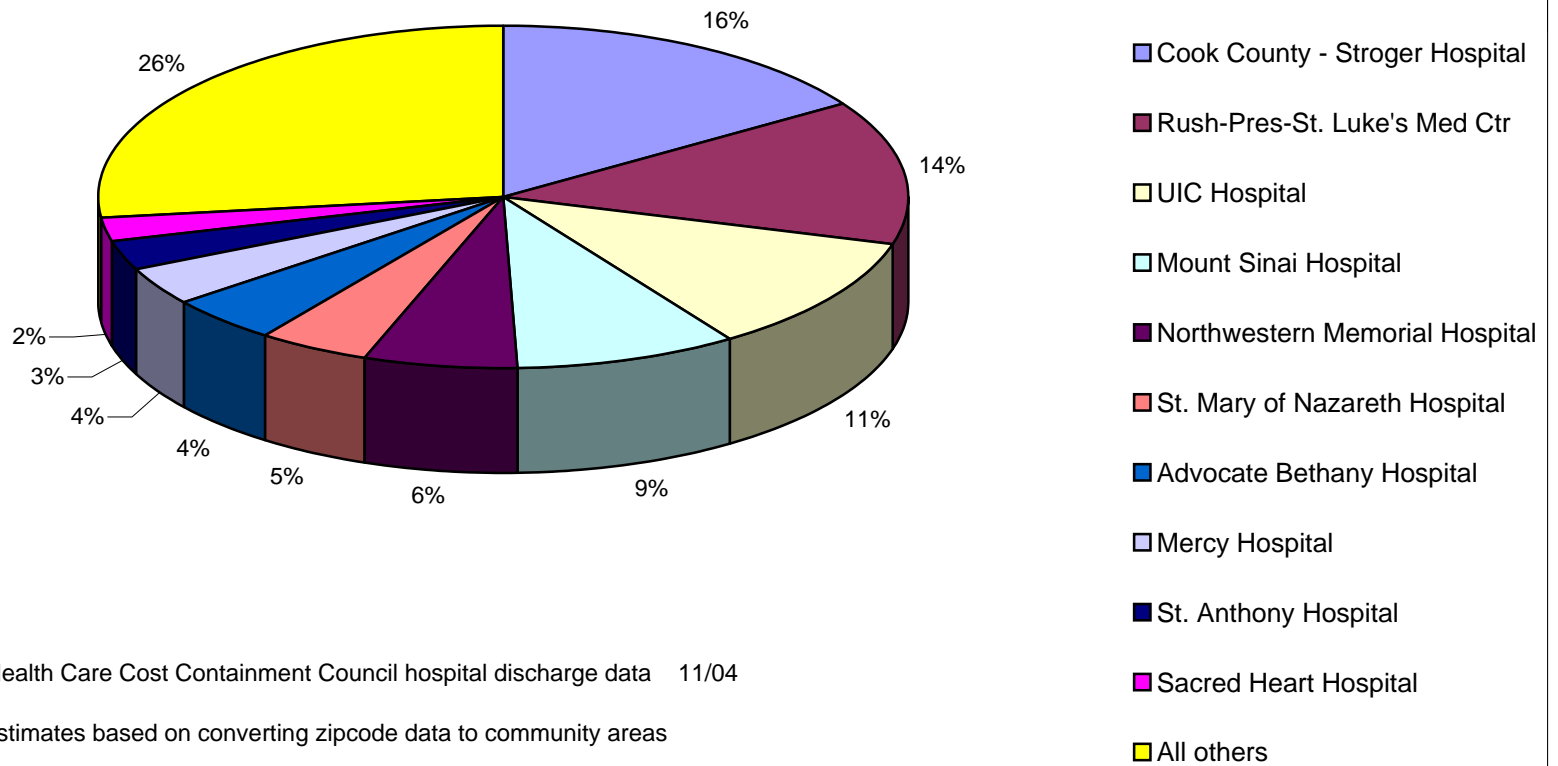
